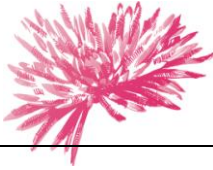

Floriculture Department Guidelines and Rules

1. All General Information, Local and State Rules apply to the entire Agriculture/Floriculture Department.
2. Any individual or group may enter provided they have registered and have **listed ALL possible entries (Cut Flowers, Potted Plants, Etc.) by Division and Class on registration form.**
3. **The entry fee is \$1.00 each or 5 for \$1.00.** Entry forms are due to the Fair Entry Office no later than Friday May 7th 4:00 pm. Any and all entries not listed on entry form on the above date **will not** be accepted at receiving time.
4. The Exhibitor must have grown plant material entered in the Cut Plants' Divisions. In the fresh-cut flower classes, three stems with blooms must be displayed in each container. Containers will be provided.
5. Container plant entries must have been in Exhibitor's possession for at least 90 days.
6. Exhibitor need not grow plant material used in the Design sections. Dried plant material only may be treated or painted.
7. Container plants and dried plant material designs will remain on exhibit for the duration of each Show Sequence.
8. No artificial flowers, plants or fruits may be used unless otherwise specified.
9. All property should be marked with the owner's name. Every effort will be made to safe-guard property, but neither Fair Management nor Fair Staff will be responsible for lost, stolen or damaged property.
10. When name of variety is known, **PLEASE** indicate on the entry form. The classes may be sub-divided when the number of entries so warrants.
11. **Judging will begin at 2pm for each sequence except for first showing No exhibitors are allowed in the building during the judging process.**
12. Exhibits may be removed the morning after the last day of each sequence between 1pm – 4pm.
13. Plant material on the California State Conservation and Endangered Species list can be used only in Educational Exhibits.

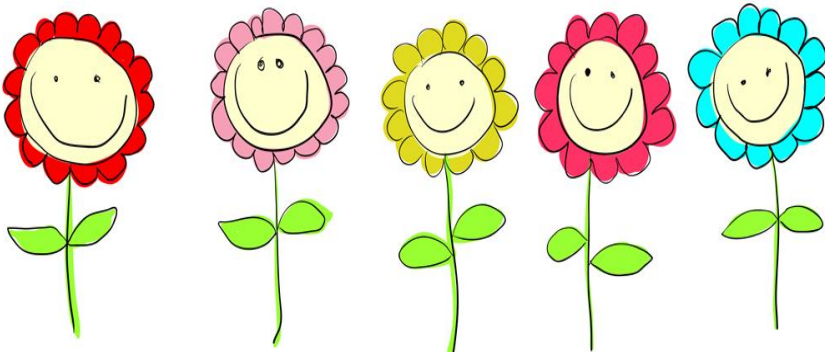
