### Livestock Educational Display Rules & Guidelines:

The Livestock Educational Display will be judged at random with emphasis on the following items:

### Clean Barn Rules & Guidelines:

1. The Livestock Superintendent will make inspections at unannounced times each day by a committee appointed.
2. All Clubs/Chapters must have a sign clearly visible for the duration of the Fair. If the group's sign is displayed that is an automatic entry for the contest. If signs are not displayed, the Club/Chapter will not be considered for any awards.

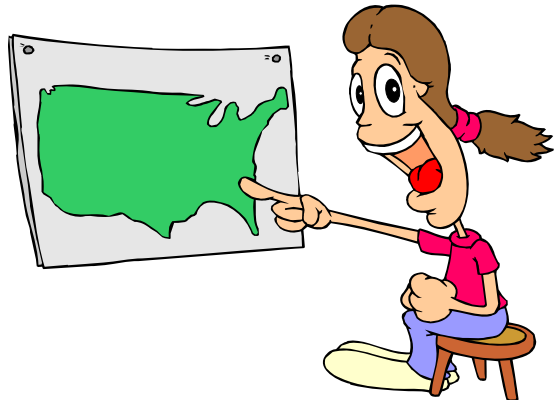
1. Use of Fair Theme "**Green Acres**"; Use of signage, illustrations; Presentation Methods; and the Ease of understanding by the Public.
2. Clubs, Chapters or individuals may enter. Name and club or chapter must be on back of display.
3. Must include subject on enter form

### Judging Guidelines and Score Sheet

#### **Cleanliness of Alley, Pens and Animals: 75 Pts**

Are the Alleyways free of straw, litter and hazardous equipment:	20 pts
Is equipment, such as pitchforks, rakes, straw, wire, etc. stored safely to allow for clear public access:	15 pts
Are the pens clean and fresh appearing:	20 pts
Are the animals free of soil, watered, appear fed and well kept:	20 pts
Does the youth show respect for the public and fellow exhibitors:	5 pts
Is the display creatively and attractively arranged? Does it show member planning and involvement:	5 pts
Does club/chapter have member on duty to clean/answer questions:	10 pts
Are all cattle double tied; all pens securely latched:	<u>5 pts</u>
<b>Total:</b>	<b>100 Pts</b>

1. The object of this class is two-fold: To enhance the Dairy Animal and to promote the natural fiber- Cotton; and a fashion parade of imaginatively attired junior exhibitors and well- behaved 100% Dairy Cattle and 100% Dairy Goats females. No Boer Goats (full blood or percentage) are allowed.
2. The contest will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment worn must be made of a fabric containing a **minimum of 60% Cotton**.
3. Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goats must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter and must be shown at the 2010 San Bernardino County Fair.
4. If deemed necessary by the Fair Management, two age group or animal classes may be formed after entries close.
5. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.

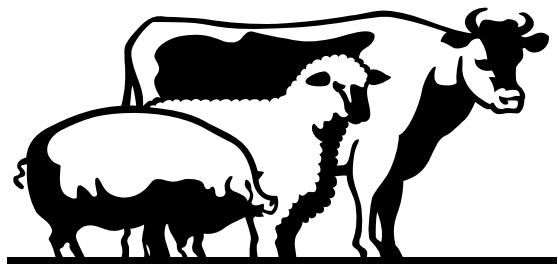

1. The object of this class is two-fold: a fashion parade of imaginatively attired young Lads & Lassies and well-behaved halter led sheep.
2. The contestant will be judged on modern fashionable dress selected, which must be attractive and lend style to the class. The garment must be made of wool or at least 70% wool blend, or by-products of sheep. All wool must be natural or natural wool blend. No synthetic wool's (man-made) will be allowed.
3. Sheep must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. All rules for exhibiting sheep at the San Bernardino County Fair shall govern.
4. Winners will be eligible for the 2010 California State Fair Lads and Lassies Competition.
5. Garments may be worn only once at this fair by the same exhibitor.

Stations may include but are not limited to: identification of parts, breeds, cuts of meat, structural differences, tools and equipment, etc.

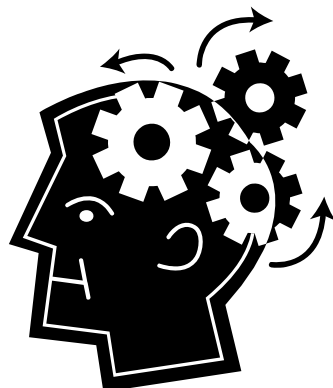
